ISHPEMING, Mich., Nov. 4.—(UP)—Seven bodies have been recovered from the Barnes Hoek Iron mine in which 53 miners are believed to have lost their lives. The men were drowned in a sea of mud and quicksand when the bottom fell out of the swamp above the workings. It is not believed possible that any of the submerged miners are still alive.
