ALAMEDA, Cal., Nov. 5.—(United News)—A dramatic decree, dictated and signed by King George III of England 121 years ago, has come into the possession of Mrs. F. M. Gale, Alameda, bequeathed to her by George Gibson, of Pleasanton.
