LOCAL MEN GIVE THEIR APPROVAL TO SHALE COMPANY

Officially presenting to the public their investigation of the Pacific Lumber and Shales Company, formerly the Hartman Syndicate, and the activities of this company since it has been under the direction of Charles D. Crouch, president, a local committee, composed of J. H. Hardy and T. R. Hardy, G. H. Pierce, O. F. Carson, H. G. Enders, Sr., H. G. Enders, Jr., James Barrett, J. H. Fuller, S. D. Taylor and E. D. Briggs, presented their report to a general meeting of interested local citizens Thursday evening.

The report which went into detail as to the possibilities of the industry, stated that after a thorough investigation, "We believe that the people of Ashland, as well as all others interested in shale oil production, should use their influence and financial help at this time to put the plant in active operation, for if the said plant is put in active and successful operation we believe it will be one of the greatest industries on the Pacific coast."


Charles D. Crouch, explained some of the work that was being done at the plant, and declared that with the present adjustments made in the report he was positive that oil could be refined at a handsome profit.
