

TWO PARTY SYSTEM HAS STRONGER HOLD

Prospects for Third Party Are at Lowest Ebb Since 1912

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16.—Recent developments have given the two-party system a firmer hold than ever. Prospects of a formidable third party or other independent movement are at the lowest point since 1912.

The situation is illustrated by the effort of Senator Borah to have one of the La Follette insurgents, Senator Frazier of North Dakota, restored to a regular status in the senate republican organization, likewise by the eagerness of regular republican leaders to do this.

Some of the most sanguine insurgents have come reluctantly to the conclusion that third party activity is useless now. The feeling is growing among them that the only practical method is that of the Anti-Saloon League and the American Federation of Labor—working from the inside.

Also is a wood club, and has face "laid back" at a somewhat more angle from the perpendicular than the Driver. Hence, when it strikes the ball it tends to "loft it," or elevate it more above the horizontal. There will be a slight loss of distance thereby. Nevertheless, most beginners get best results from the Brassie. Your Brassie is used off the starting tee also mid field on the fairway if distance is called for, and is used similar to your driver, gripping your club handle two inches from the end with your left hand firm and right underneath close to your left hand, gripping the club handle by the fingers only. Now the easiest way to get your stance or addressing the ball is to draw a letter T. Get equal distance space with your feet from leg of T then leave your club flat in the crown of the T. This will keep your hands hanging straight down from the front of your body

slacken your knees a trifle this brings the equal weight on both heels and not the toes. Let the shoulders bend over towards the ball a trifle, then make your club swing on the T crown. This forms a point motion to the shoulders, hips and knees. Don't sway and keep your eyes glued on the spot the ball rests on until your ball has got well on its way down the fairway. Practice until you feel the rhythm. Next article will be the (mid-iron).
