Log Cabin On Wheels Coming Here Thursday



wo-inch shell. The house has a bedroom, a living room, a kitchen and dining room, as well as two closets.. It is electrically equipped throughout and has two

folding beds. Mr. Wade who constructed the novel house, is now on an extended eastern tour and his trip will be made under the auspices of the Douglas Fir Extension Service.
