EXPERIMENTAL FARM TO START OPERATION SOON

TOMAH, Wis., Nov. 17.—(UP)—Valley farm, comprising more than 2,000 acres, owned by H. L. Stevens, will be developed into a model community farm and center for demonstrations of livestock and field crops, according to plans under way here. The aim in establishing the farm, according to Stevens, is to provide a local experiment station where the latest farm projects can be tried out on a scale which is not always practicable on smaller farms. The three main crops on the farm will be corn, alfalfa and sweet clover.
