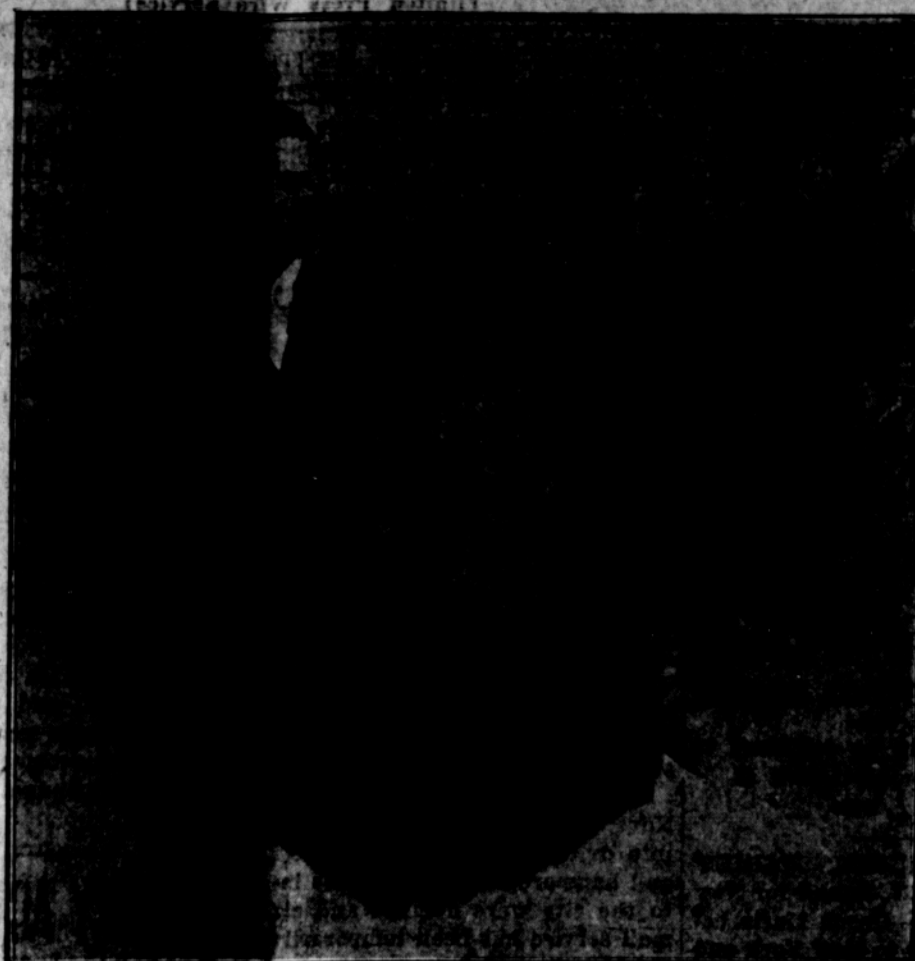

NURSERY STOCK INSPECTION

Large lots of nursery stock are being shipped into the county at the present time; these trees are all thoroughly inspected by local county fruit inspectors and those found infested with injurious insects and diseases are condemned.

The Woolly Aphis, appearing as cotton like masses on the roots and around the graft or bud unions is especially bad this year and it would be well for growers who are planting, to dip the roots of all the young trees in a solution of nicotine sulphate, one pint to one hundred gallons of water.

This practice is a good precautionary measure even though the stock appears clean. A small amount of caution at planting time may save time, grief and dollars later.
