Expert Says Present Plan for Buying Has Re-mained the Same

CHICAGO, Nov. 18 .- Exclusive of real estate, stocks and bonds the annual sales under the installment plan in this country total Typewriter for Shot Gun in A-1 \$6,179,000,000, a figure which is remarkably stable and which has not increased appreciably in the last years, according to a report submitted recently by Milan Ayres, industrial economist and analyst, to the third national auomotive financing conference
