INSTALLMENT SALES OVER SIX MILLION

Expert Says Present Plan for Buying Has Remained the Same

CHICAGO, Nov. 18.—Exclusive of real estate, stocks and bonds, the annual sales under the installment plan in this country total \$6,179,000,000, a figure which is remarkably stable and which has not increased appreciably in the last years, according to a report submitted recently by Milan V. Ayres, industrial economist and analyst, to the third national automotive financing conference here.
Disproving the contention that installment buying is mortgaging the future income of the American people to such an extent that in time of financial stress the economic structure of the nation would crumble, Ayres pointed out that the average outstanding debt accruing from installment buying is only \$2,638,000,000 or 43.7 per cent of the total sales.
After making searching investigations over a long period, the economist found that:
The outstanding installment debt varies only slightly from month to month.
The preponderance of installment buying is in automobiles.
The total increase in installment buying between 1923 and 1925 was only 3 per cent, while savings deposits increased 37 per cent.
The total installment debt is only a very slight percentage of the national income estimated at seventy billion dollars, and that no material amount of installment payments would be defaulted in hard times.

Y. M. C. A. Work Is In Varied Fields

Throughout its whole existence, the Y. M. C. A. has worked with the home, the Church and the school, endeavoring to supplement these agencies, rather than to supplant them. One of the results growing out of this cooperation has been, the Christian Citizenship Program, which is four fold in its scope, recognizing the physical, social, vocational and intellectual phases of a boy's life as found in Luke 2:52: "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man." The program is progressive in its entirety, taking a boy into the membership of a club at the age of nine years, and carrying him on through to young manhood. The first step in this program is known as Friendly Indians, and has for its setting the friendly Indians who helped Lewis and Clarke in their long journey into the Northwest—real service. The next step is the Pioneers, boys 12-14 years, who receive their inspiration and setting from those Christian Pioneers who were ever seeking new fields, and through Christian service and devotion building a great Christian commonwealth. These boys seek to emulate their example by Pioneering in the Christian cause. Next in line are the Comrades, boys 15-17 years of age. These older boys are now comrades in the Great Cause, and are seeking to carry on, "remembering always that 'Life is not a goblet to be drained, but a measure to be filled' ". The final step in this program is the Young Men's clubs, for young men 18 to 25 years of age. These clubs are organized among the young men in industry and college life, fitting these young men in Christian Citizenship to take their stand in world affairs and in every walk of life. The Christian Citizenship Program is not a separate organization, but rather a program of Christian citizenship to be worked with boys in all walks of life, wherever a group can be formed or a need found. There is one Comrade Club and a tribe of Friendly Indians now formed in Ashland, and the formation of others is under way. Thus the Y. M. C. A. working with the church, is able to take a boy at the age of nine and hold him with an allround program of development till he is ready to take his place of leadership in the affairs of the nation.
