

CLAIM TURKEYS ARE BIGGER AND BETTER

Head of Turkey Supply Says Birds Are Healthier Than Usual

CUREO, Texas, Nov. 24.—(U. N.)—Old King Gobbler is strutting his stuff bigger and better than ever this year at Cureo, the concentration point of the nation's Thanksgiving day meat supply.

The turkey raisers in this little community which boasts that it is the turkey capital of the world, declare that the bronzed bird is not only healthier and more luscious this year than ever before, but that also there is more of him.

The turkey packers have shipped 13 cars of dressed turkeys from here to date, compared to 12 last season. The shipment would have been much heavier, but the turkey crop is said to be about two weeks late. For this reason the bulk of an enormous week-end influx of turkeys was too late for the Thanksgiving market.

The first shipment of birds to reach the market here, were undeveloped but in splendid condition, according to shippers. S. F. Dixon of the Dixon Packing Company, Houston, said that his firm had dressed 15,000 pounds of turkeys this season and that they

were in excellent condition—much better than usual at this time of the year.

Price of turkey quoted the first of the week was 35 cents a pound on the farm or two cents higher delivered to packers.

It is estimated the total turkey shipment during the entire season will be between 25 and 30 car loads.

WINBURN TURNS TO CADDIES

NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—A new profession for their sex, that of acting as golf caddies, will be open to the young women of Harrison, N. Y., when a contemplated public golf course is completed here on 251 acres of land recently purchased by Jesse Winburn, banker, who at one time resided in Ashland, Oregon.

Healthful recreation for the girls and suitable caddies for women golfers will be the result of his plan, Winburn believes. The announcement, coming from him, was in the way of a right-about face, for when Winburn, who is president of the Bronxville Gold association, purchased the Bronxville golf club last year, he enforced a ruling that no women should be permitted to use the links.

"They play golf only as a means for gossip and social advancement," he said then.—Portland Oregonian.
