### HALIBUT CATCH IS LIGHTEST IN YEARS

But Small Quantity Taken Off Coast Near Astoria This Year

ASTORIA, Nov. 25.—(U. N.)—Landings of halibut here during the nine-months season just ended were exceptionally light.

Only 55,500 pounds were delivered at Astoria during the season. The catch of black cod, however, was normal, amounting to 135,795 pounds.

Scarcity of halibut, not only on the Oregon banks but in the landings at Puget Sound and British Columbia points forced the price upward. An average of 18 cents per pound was paid to the fishermen.

The 1926 halibut haul here brought \$10,548 to the fishermen while the men received \$6299 for their black cod, which averaged 4.5 cents per pound.

The record catch for the season was brought in by Ulrich Peterson in his schooner Mermald, which landed 5619 pounds of halibut and 28,214 pounds of black cod after one trip.

### CANDIED SWEET POTATOES

6 Medium Potatoes  
1/4 Teaspoon Salt  
Juice of 1 Lemon  
1/4 Cup Snowdrift  
1/4 Cup Sugar  
1 Cup Boiling Water

Boil potatoes in salt water until tender. Pour off water and steam out to prevent sogginess. Peel and slice lengthwise. Brown on both sides in hot Snowdrift. Dissolve 1/4 cup sugar in cup boiling water and pour over browned potatoes in pan. Cook until syrup thickens. Squeeze lemon over potatoes and serve.

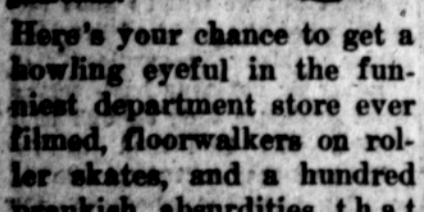
