Notre Dame and Southern California to Play Final Game

TUCSON, Ariz., Dec. 2.—(UN)—Minus the rooting cohorts—but accompanied by Knute Rockne, the football team of the University of Notre Dame arrived here tonight with the South Bend mentor in a pessimistic frame of mind regarding Saturday's intersection battle with the Southern California Trojans at Los Angeles.

"We are going to try to hold down the score," Rockne told the United News and had little else to say regarding the outcome of the game.

The Notre Dame team will rest here for two days, with final work outs on the University of Arizona field.

The Fighting Irish will get a workout tomorrow morning and afternoon, the first since their defeat last Saturday at Pittsburgh at the hands of Carnegie Tech.

On Friday the team will be given another workout before entering for Los Angeles, where they meet the "thundering herd." "The Arizona climate did us a lot of good two years ago," Rockne said, "and it should help some this year."

INTENSE COLD WAVE HITS MIDDLE WEST

Mercury Drops Forty Five Degrees in Twelve Hours

CHICAGO, Dec. 2.—(UN)—An intense cold wave from the Mackenzie river valley, Canada, riding on the wings of a whipping nor'easter, helped usher in December and real winter in the north and midwest, causing the mercury to drop as much as 45 degrees in 12 hours and bringing a seasonal record temperature of 26 degrees below zero to Crookston, Minn.

Seven steamers were held fast in an ice jam off West Neshish, Ont., while another vessel was abandoned by tugs and freighters which had hoped to pull it off the rocks.

Shipping on the Great Lakes was menaced by a blizzard Wednesday and navigation was virtually abandoned.

Drifts as high as ten feet were reported in the upper Michigan peninsula, where one of the heaviest nor'easters in half a century was encountered, while snow from five inches to a foot in depth fell all over northern Minnesota.

Oregon Facing Large Deficit

SALEM, Dec. 2.—(UN)—Oregon's state government will have a deficit of approximately \$931,255 on December 31, which marks the end of the biennium, according to a financial statement prepared by Secretary of State Sam Koser.

It is made plain in the statement that the deficit which will represent the difference between money on hand and the general fund obligations, may be slightly less or more than these figures, depending on expenses between now and the first of the year.

requested that the Jordan Valley road in Malheur county be designated as a state highway and be improved as fast as possible!

The commission listened to a plea from Senator B. L. Eddy of Roseburg in behalf of another Cascade mountain road, the North Umpqua, which, he said, would shorten the distance from Portland to Crater Lake via Diamond Lake by 90 miles. He also asked that it be designated as a forest highway.

time after time Albert B. Fall notified inquiring oil companies that the government had no intention of throwing open its California naval oil reserves. One persistent prospective bidder complained of too much secrecy about the interior department's intentions and was advised by Fall that the Hawaiian plans were "on one's business."

All this was about the time that the first Hawaiian contract was let to Doheny in April, 1922, several months after Fall had received \$100,000 from Doheny in the little brown satchel.

High Spots
The high spots of the government's case are these:

Fall obtained complete control of the naval oil reserves through the Harding executive order transferring jurisdiction to him. Doheny advanced his \$100,000 a transaction which Fall sought to conceal by trying to mislead the senate investigating committee.

Five months later, while Fall was throwing competing concerns off guard, he directed the execution of the first Pearl harbor contract, giving Doheny the right to build storage tanks for the navy in exchange for naval royalty crude oil.

This contract contained a preferential clause under which Doheny, the following December, obtained the big Elk Hills drilling contract, which he told the senate committee should return him a

profit of \$100,000,000. Those contracts were let allegedly in consideration of the \$100,000 ad-

vanced to Fall by Doheny. Already by cross examination the defense has shaped the general outline of its defense which will be filled in as its witnesses begin to testify tomorrow.
