Curse Seems To Follow Jewels

LONDON, Dec. 3.—The mysterious curse that is reputed to follow precious jewels, struck with the rapidity of lightning against Aga Khan today, only a few hours after he had bought one of the world's largest diamonds.

The Indian potentate had returned to his hotel after buying "Golden Dawn," a 61 1/2 carat stone at auction for \$57,000, when a messenger delivered to him the following United Press News from Paris:

"Princess Agatha Theresa Aga Khan, wife of the famous Aga Khan, is dead."

The princess underwent an operation a week ago, but was proving a few days ago, when her husband came to London to bid for the huge diamond.

The Aga Khan was stunned. He was informed that the princess' relapse came without warning and that emergency measures to save her life had failed.

The sale at Christie's auction rooms, where the potentate acquired the famous stone, was the first time it had been offered for sale. And the auction itself was the result of bad luck of the man who discovered it in a Kimberley diamond mine in 1913.

Captain C. R. Lucas, its owner, had given the Aga Khan a mortgage on Golden Dawn and when the sale money was paid over, Lucas, himself, received not a dollar of it.

Because of its comparative newness the Golden Dawn has not yet become known as bringer of bad luck, as are the Hope diamond and others.

In its original state the diamond weighed 183 carats. Soon after he had found it, Captain Lucas was offered \$200,000 for it. He first had it cut at an Amsterdam jeweler's shop and then sought to sell it. Then he induced the Aga Khan to take over a mortgaged he had been forced to place on it.

NATURAL BARRIERS ARE TO BE REMOVED

Concession Given to Mine Gold in Eastern Siberia

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 3.—Natural barriers that have surrounded eastern Siberia's legendary alderado for almost a century will give way next spring to modern American machinery.

A concession to mine gold in this region has just been granted by the Russian government to B. A. Hammerfchmidt, M. M. Ritschford, T. E. Lord and Carlstedt Baker, the latter a former San Franciscan now in this country from his home in Manchuria.

It has been learned here that machinery for the venture will be assembled at an early date and that the advance section of the expedition will leave early in 1927. Geologists first will survey the region, going by way of the Amur river, past the scene of the Nikovskit massacre which threw Saghalin's oil fields into an international wrangle between the Russian and Japanese governments and an American oil concern.

The gold fields to be visited have a far heavier toll of gold hunters than has the Klondike.

In the winter of 1923-24 four American geologists were at the mouth of the treacherous Amur river. Two were preparing to cross the Gulf of Tartary on dog sleds to inspect the oil fields and

the seal of adventurers throughout the orient. The concession fast awarded, long and eagerly sought by many mining men, boy, on the entire productive area.

A little later a group of Japanese argonauts arrived at the Amur's mouth to search of the mysterious gold field. The fate of the three expeditions caused a revival of the oriental legend that the gold of Amur was cursed.

The geologists were driven back by blizzards. The oil adventurers reached Saghalin, were arrested by Japanese soldiers and sent back to the mainland. The Japanese adventurers tarried at Nikolayev to pray at the spot where 700 of their countrymen were slain in 1919. Their piety turned to frenzy. They became pirates, hoisted the black flag and to avenge their compatriots sailed the gulf like madmen. In the looting and killing that followed Russian fishermen were made the victims of cruel tortures.

When the gulf finally was cleared the Japanese put in at a northern Japanese fishing port, gave themselves up and today are serving sentences varying in periods. The only gold brought out of the Amur fields has been in original nuggets which stirred

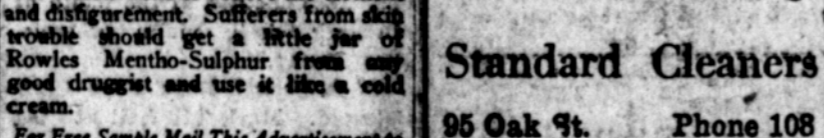
