**NOTICE OF ASSESSMENTS ON ACCOUNT OF THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE PAVEMENT OF "C" STREET BETWEEN PIONEER AVENUE AND FIFTH STREET WITH MAGASAM PAVEMENT AND CEMENT CURBS AND GUTTERS.**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, did on the 27th day of November, 1926, by City Ordinance No. 339, levy against the several pieces and parcels of property abutting on "C" Street, between Pioneer Avenue and Fifth Street, the assessments as set forth in said ordinance, on account of the improvement of said street with Magasam pavement and cement curbs and gutters.

Said assessments will be due and payable within ten days after date of this publication, date of said publication being Dec. 4th, 1926.

If the owner of any property so assessed for such paving and curb and gutter improvement, in the sum of twenty-five dollars or more, at any time within ten days from date hereof, so desires, he may have the time of payment extended by signing an application, as provided by law, at the City Recorder's Office.

Where the assessment is less than twenty-five dollars, and where the application for the extension of payment shall not have been made and filed with the City Recorder, within the ten days specified, the same shall be due and payable in cash within thirty days from and after the expiration of ten days from date of publication.

If default is made in payment, after the expiration of the time allowed, such assessments will be docketed as a lien upon the property, and will be subject to six per cent penalty together with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum from the date of delinquency, in the manner provided in Sections 1 and 2 of Article 12 of the Charter of the City of Ashland.

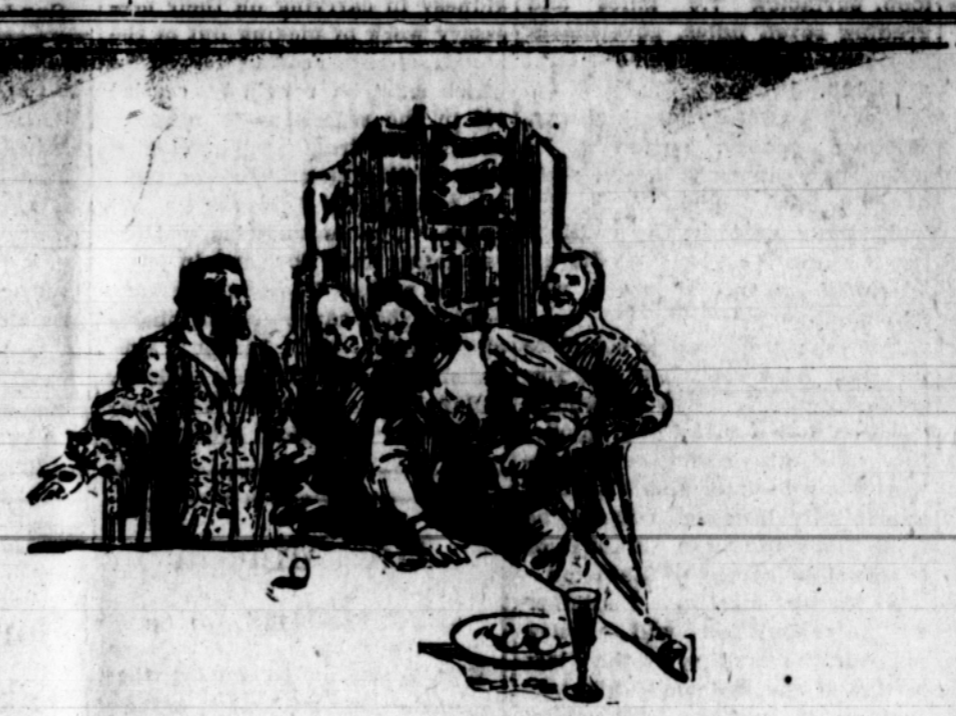
