### Mountain Lions Menace Livestock

#### YOSEMITE, Cal., Dec. 6.—

(UN)—The menace of mountain lions to California livestock is becoming of a serious nature, according to Jay C. Bruce, official lion hunter for the California state fish and game commission. Bruce has 284 notches in his rifle, representing killings of animals that prey on wild life valuable to man and upon domesticated stock.

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"Each mountain lion in California annually kills deer valued at a thousand dollars," he said. "However, there is little danger of the lions attacking a human being."

Bruce declared that mountain lions apparently "kill for fun," seemingly deriving great enjoyment out of killing harmless animals and carrying off sheep, cattle and hogs.

#### CLAREMONT, Cal., Dec. 6.—

(UP)—The Scripps College for women will open to a freshman class of 80 members here in the fall of 1927. The new school will be located near Pomona college and will be under the federated Claremont colleges plan. Dean Ernest J. Jaqua will be director.
