### COFFEE CAKE

1/4 Cup Snowdrift  
1/4 Cup Milk  
1/4 Teaspoon Salt  
1 Teaspoon Vanilla Extract  
1 Teaspoon Lemon Extract  
1 Cup Sugar  
2 Cups Sifted Flour  
3 Teaspoons Baking Powder  
1/2 Cup Chopped Walnuts  
1 Teaspoon Cinnamon  
Cream sugar and Snowdrift together. Add sifted flour, baking powder and salt, to this mixture alternately with the milk. Bake in a shallow pan well oiled; sprinkle cinnamon, 2 tablespoons sugar and walnuts over top. Bake in hot oven for fifteen minutes.
