NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 28th day of December, 1926, at the hour of eight o'clock p. m., the Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, will open and consider bids for the purchase of general obligation bonds of the City of Ashland, Jackson County, Oregon, which may have been filed as hereinafter provided, as follows:

(a) "Water Bonds" numbered 928 to 977 inclusive, aggregating \$50,000.00, par value, said bonds being a portion of those issued pursuant to Article XXIV of the Charter, and Ordinance No. 841 of said city, to be dated January 1, 1927; the bonds herein offered for sale having the following respective maturities:

Bonds numbered 928 to 937 inclusive aggregating \$10,000.00 payable January 1, 1929;

Bonds numbered 938 to 947 inclusive aggregating \$10,000.00 payable January 1, 1930;

The interest rate on said bonds so offered for sale is to be fixed by the bidders. Said bonds will be ready for delivery on January 15, 1927.

(Explanation: The above water bonds are issued pursuant to Article XXIV of the Charter of the City of Ashland, and are to be sold for the purpose of providing funds with which a storage reservoir to augment the supply of water to said city may be constructed, and for the further purpose of making betterments in the distribution works and lines of the water system of said city. The aggregate issue is \$450,000.00; \$50,000.00 in amount of said bonds is to be sold under this notice and the balance of \$400,000.00 or so much thereof as is necessary to complete the project, to be sold when funds are needed.)
