Victim Of Errant Love Is Buried

PRAIRIE DU CHIEN, Wis., Dec. 8.—(UN)—For the second time the body of Clara Olson, little home girl, who died a victim of an errant love, rests in a grave. This time it is not face downward in a crudely shallow grave, as old Christ Olson, her father, had pictured her in his dreams that came tragically true. It rests in a gray casket, lowered formally today into a hillside plot in Utica Lutheran cemetery, overlooking the snow covered Kickapoo valley. A biting north wind swirled the snow into little drifts along the roadside as the funeral cortege moved slowly from the church where last rites were pronounced. Only brief services had been held at the Olson's big white house at Seneca—short prayers in Norwegian, the chanting of strange songs and then the casket was carried out to the hearse by six young men with whom Clara had grown up in the valley.

Mickey Walker Is Still The Champion

CHICAGO, Dec. 8.—(UN)—Mickey Walker became the undisputed middleweight champion of the world today, when the Illinois boxing commission upheld Referee Benny Yanger's decision in the Walker-Flowers bout at the Coliseum last Friday night. But after January 1 two judges will be at the ringside in addition to the referee, the boxing commission decided, in order to avoid the repetition of the storms of protest which followed Yanger's decision, and the stigma
