Propose Merger Of Irrigation District
SALEM, Dec. 8.—(UN)—The proposed merger of the north side irrigation district with the adjoining Jordan valley irrigation district, both in Malheur county, has aroused a situation submitted by the state irrigation securities commission to Attorney General Van Winkle in which the state would be accepting payment on a debt which has not yet materialized.

Before the merger can take place the north side district must be dissolved and this cannot take place until the district has taken care of its entire indebtedness, included in this indebtedness is money which the state has advanced in the payment of interest on the district bonds, and also interest on the district bonds, and also interest on state bonds, sold in order to pay the district's interest. These payments are not due, nor will they be due in some cases for about 30 years.
