next biennium. There was appropriated for this institution two years ago \$215,000, exclusive of deficiency appropriations of \$21,400.

The state school for the blind has requested appropriations aggregating \$56,499, as against \$50,000 authorized by the legislature two years ago. A deficiency appropriation of \$800 was authorized by the state emergency board for this institution.

The 1927-28 budget for the state school for the deaf has been fixed at \$148,039 by the budget commission, as compared with \$113,000 for the current biennium.

### WILBUR SAYS NAVY IS TO CONCENTRATE ON AVIATION

flight of Commander Byrd, the numerous cruises of the dirigible Los Angeles and the Alaskan aerial survey.

The appointment of Edward P. Warner as assistant secretary of the navy in charge of aviation and the five year program passed by Congress are regarded as two of the outstanding events of the year in the Navy department.

"The morale of the Navy is high and the devotion to duty on the part of both officers and enlisted men is well worthy of commendation," Secretary Wilbur declared.

Desertions have dropped to a minimum and re-enlistments continue high. The health of the navy is satisfactory and the number of persons in the service admitted to hospitals during the year is the lowest on record.

Operating forces of the Navy totaled approximately 82,000 enlisted men during the year although the program was established upon a basis of 86,000. However, due to the delay in completion of the two aircraft carriers the reduction in personnel was less serious than it might have been, it is pointed out.

During the year the navy operated 15 first class battleships, 76 submarines, 103 destroyers, 17 light cruisers, 76 submarines, 25 mine sweepers, 141 aircraft and numerous other smaller vessels.

Increased threat of political turmoil in China forced the Navy to draw from its Asiatic destroyer squadron for additions to the Yangtze River patrol. Six new river gunboats are also under construction in China and should be placed in active service within a few months.

Of the Asiatic fleet four ships are declared to be in poor condition, and one, the Helena, is not fit for sea duty. All of this fleet is in need of modern radio equipment.

Major accidents to the Navy during the year were reported as follows: The grounding of the collier Orion and the mine sweeper Curlew, both of which were complete losses.

The explosion of the submarine S-49 at New London and the destruction of the naval ammunition depot at Lake Denmark, N.H.
