### REVISED FARM BILL BROUGHT UP AGAIN

#### Oregon Senator Hopes to See Early Action on His Measure

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—(UN)—The revised McNary-Haugen farm bill, representing the renewed movement for agricultural relief was added today to the tangle of legislation facing the senate.

It provides a revolving fund of \$250,000,000 and detains the equalization fee.

While Senator McNary, Oregon republican, who drew up the new measure after conference with farm leaders, hopes for early action.
