Put water and Snowdrift in saucepan, when it comes to boiling point add flour all at one time and stir and beat until it leaves the sides of pan. Remove from stove and add one at a time the eggs, beating in each egg well be-fore adding the next. Drop by spoonfuls on a greased baking sheet. Bake from 35 to 45 minutes, according to size, in oven 500 degrees F. for the first five minutes, reducing about 50 degrees at a time every five minutes, until when they begin to brown the temperature is 350 degrees F. When the puff leaves the greased bak-ing sheet easily, they are done and should be cooled on a rack with a circulation of air all about. When cold, fill with whipped cream.
