CHARACTER WITNESSES TESTIFY FOR OFFICIAL

High Officials Stand Back of Former Prohibition Head

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 14. (UN) - The case of Colonel Ned M. Green, deposed federal prohibition administrator, accused of withdrawing confiscated liquor for personal use, moved nearer the jury room today as an impressive array of character witnesses testified for the defense.

Colonel Andrew S. Rowan, who carried the "message to Garcia," declared from the witness stand that the defendant was one of his closest friends and that Green was "of the highest integrity, truthful and sober."

Colonel J. L. Dodge, an army man for 21 years and provost marshal of the American army of occupation in Germany, testified that he had known Green for 26 years and found his character highly praiseworthy.

Dodge also gave testimony which directly refuted one of the strong points in the prosecution's case. The witness described the champagne dinner served in Green's hotel rooms, but declared prosecution accounts of freely flowing liquor were erroneous.

"I took a bottle of Scotch to the dinner and that was the only liquor there until Ivan Johnson arrived with two bottles of champagne," he said.

Johnson, a young newspaper man, previously testified that Green had asked him to bring the champagne and that Green himself had supplied a large amount of Scotch whiskey.

EUGENE BOARD TO TRY TO SETTLE TROUBLE

Athletic Coach Asked if He Would Exchange Places With Other School

EUGENE, Dec. 16. (UN) - New developments are expected soon in the Eugene high school controversy following the board of education's decision that it would try to settle the difficulty.

Superintendent J. Jones, acting on instructions from the board, has asked R. G. Brown, athletic coach at the high school, if he would be willing to trade places with an instructor at another school.

Brown declined to give an answer but said he would consider the matter.

S. M. Calkins, attorney has been asked to arrange a settlement with A. C. Bouck, secretary to Principal J. G. Swan, who has been asked to resign. This action indicates that Bouck will not be retained in the school system for the remainder of his one-year contract. A petition signed by 175 students of the institution requesting the return of Brown is in the hands of the board.
