MAN WHO STARTED CASE AGAINST PROF STOKES IN DAYTON TRIAL WILL TEST MISSISSIPPI LAW

NEW ORLEANS, (UP) — Undaunted by the temporary setback the cause which he championed in Tennessee has received, George W. Rappleyea, formerly of Dayton, Tenn., is preparing to launch a movement to test the anti-evolution law recently enacted in Mississippi.

It was young Rappleyea who filed the charges against Thomas R. Stokes, the high school teacher of Dayton, Tenn.

Speaking to a congregation at the First Unitarian church here recently, Mr. Stokes declared that he and his friends were only waiting the final outcome of the Stokes case in Tennessee before starting their campaign to nullify the anti-evolution statute in Mississippi.

Mr. Rappleyea said he is certain the Tennessee Supreme Court will declare the state's anti-evolution law unconstitutional and added that "if the State Supreme Court declares the law constitu-

tional we will take the case to the United States Supreme Court." Mr. Rappleyea expressed the opinion that politics had delayed the Tennessee Supreme Court's action on the Stokes case for some time. He believes, however, that a final decision will be handed down by the state highest tribunal soon, probably in January.

In order that no time shall be lost in the launching of the fight on Mississippi's laws, after the Tennessee case is disposed of Mr. Rappleyea and his friends have already engaged two promi-

ent attorneys in Jackson and are lected to seek a federal injunction going ahead with preliminary against the law and in this way steps to start a test case in the the case will be fought out in the Mississippi courts. Federal Court.
