Public Building Program Skippy

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—(UN)—Small cities will receive little benefit from the public buildings program authorized at the last session of congress. Secretary of the Treasury Mellon told the house buildings committee today that under the \$150,000,000 fund not more than 300 cities would receive consideration. Representative Woodrum, democrat, Virginia, brought out that six large cities, New York, Chicago, St. Louis, San Francisco, Philadelphia, and Louisville would absorb \$45,000,000 of the \$100,000,000 to be used for construction and improvement in those states.

NEW POSTOFFICE Final steps toward making Crescent Lake a regular town along the new Cascade line of the Southern Pacific, are being taken this week by G. E. Haugen, postmaster, who is establishing a fourth class postoffice at the little railroad city. Crescent Lake is reported to be swelling rapidly in point of population and a post office survey showed that some 50 families will be served by the postoffice at present. A postmaster for the new office, which will be in operation the last of the week, has not yet been named—Klamath News.

MOSCOW (UN)—Visitors from North and South America, who flocked to Moscow in greater numbers last year than at any time since the revolutionary days of 1917, have all gone home and Arctic weather now grips northern Russia. Only a small cluster of newspaper men and a few foreigners having business in Russia, remain to face the winter with the natives.

ATTACK ON LIFE OF MUSSOLINI FORETOLD BY "SPIRIT" A FEW DAYS BEFORE LAST ASSAULT

TURIN—(UP)—The last attempt on the Duce's life was prophesied from the spirit world by a departed Fascist, Amos Maramotti, according to followers of the Duce who say they communicated with the spirit shortly before the attempted assassination. The conversation with the spirit of Amos Maramotti took place in a house wherein strange physical manifestations occurred nightly. The phenomena were first noticed by a girl living in the house. One night, she was awakened by odd sounds inside closets. Each night the sinister noises became louder and more insistent. Finally, the house seemed to have been possessed by devils. Loud, ominous knocks, sudden opening and shutting of doors and windows by a mysterious power, and invisible hands which, groping in the darkness, dealt out blows and caresses according to the spirit's mood or fancy. These were the portentous omens which nightly perturbed the peace and quiet of the inmates until horror-stricken, they informed the authorities of the phenomena.
