BELLEVUE NOTES

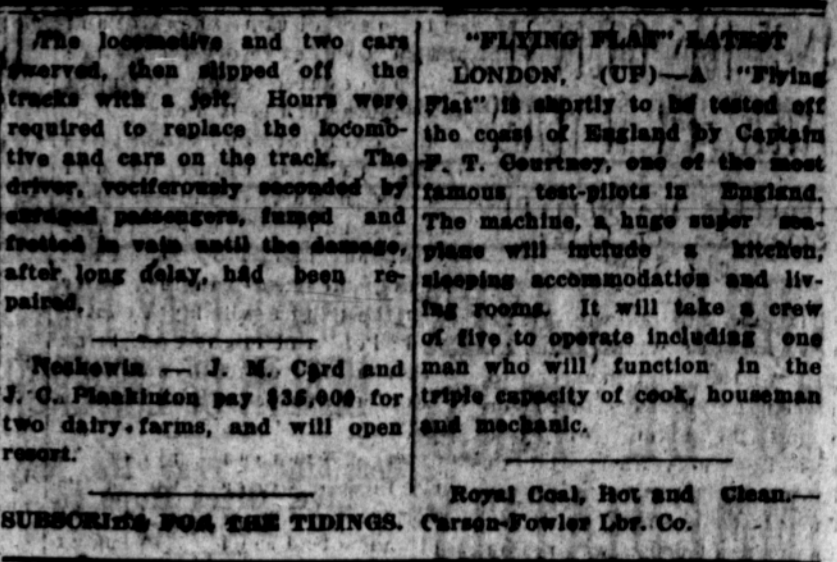

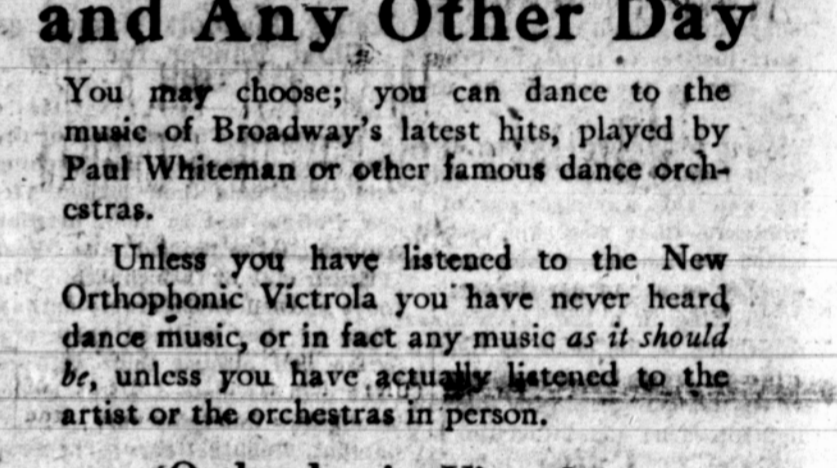
