TRAINS RACING WITH WASHING MACHINES

Electric Motors and Steam Engines Compete in Race

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Dec. 27.—1926—Two solid trains of washing machines left this city at 6:15 o'clock last night on a mad race across the continent—one pulled by one of the gigantic Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul electric motors, the other by a massive steam Mogul of the Northern Pacific.

Both trains are part of one shipment of Maytag washing machines, consigned to Maytag Pacific, Inc., distributors for Washington and Oregon, constituting the greatest single shipment of merchandise ever made to one firm, by far the greatest single shipment of washing machines and the only time in the history where two solid train loads of washers have been shipped to one company.

This is the first time in history that electricity and steam have ever contested on this basis, and the entire country will watch with tremendous interest the outcome of this race. The Northern Pacific has put on the latest and biggest type of Mogul steam engine built. The Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul is putting on a recently constructed and improved electric motor to hold up their end of the speed battle. Daily bulletins are to be sent from along the line.

Both trains were turned over to the respective railroad companies at the same minute and the two roads have given the trains passenger schedule and complete right of way, in a contest between steam and electricity to determine which road will make the earliest delivery of their trainload. The entire length of these railroad systems have been notified to clear everything for these two freights. The employees are vying with each other to speed them on.

This unusual shipment of washing machines is made by the Maytag Pacific, Inc., to start out 1927 and follows months of selling a solid trainload each month, an unheard of performance never equalled by any other distributor. This most recent feat of bringing in two solid trainloads at one time is a rather startling culmination of the world's record, they had already set and is more than ever a remarkable tribute to the prosperity of this territory and the progressiveness of its people. These trainloads are not merely being bought by the company, they are being purchased by the public at large and they prove not only the general prosperity but the individual prosperity and progressiveness of the people of this state.

It is expected that the trains will be delivered to the Maytag Pacific, Inc., on or before January 1, and each road is confident that their trainload will be the first to arrive.
