OLD PIONEER DIES
 BOISE, Idaho, Dec. 29.—(UN)
 Another character of the old west is dead and Idaho has lost one more of the dwindling human links that connect present day life with the state's colorful past.
 Tom Ranahan, a survivor of the Beecher's Island massacre in eastern Colorado, veteran of a dozen desperate encounters with Indians, half a century ago, pony express rider and stage coach driver, died at a hospital here Monday at the age of 87.
