WASHINGTON, Jan. 5.—A large wave of moral indignation is rolling up in the senate, ready to be let loose when Col. Frank L. Smith of Illinois arrives, probably this week, to claim the seat to which he was appointed following the death of Senator William B. McKinley.

But whether this will survive the parliamentary checks and the apathy of the more cynical, remains to be seen.

Smith's case will be a test forecasting the fate of Senator-elect William S. Vare of Pennsylvania, who will knock for admission when the congress assembles.
