EXPECT ANTI-EVOLUTION LAWS IN MANY STATES

NEW YORK. — (UP)—That bills outlawing the teaching of evolution will be pressed in many of the 40 state legislatures holding regular sessions in 1927 and that campaigns for such measures have already been started in South Carolina, Washington, Oregon, Kansas, Florida, Virginia and California, is asserted by the American Liberties Union. The Union has been fighting such legislation since 1925 when it instigated the Scopes trial in Dayton, Tenn., and supported the defense. It is now trying to arrange a taxpayer's suit to test the constitutionality of the Mississippi anti-evolution law.

town—Sand Springs, Okla., they buried him. And the surrounding hills were packed with automobiles and people came to pay their last respects to Charles Page, Oklahoma's great philanthropist.

And even in death Page continues to more than tithe. The bulk of his \$12,000,000 estate was left to carry on his work. To his Sand Springs one he deeded 10,000 acres of ground. There is still oil on the ground, and gas, and it is managed by a board of trustees.

Page will live in the memory of thousands of widows and children. It had been his ambition to "father" a thousand orphans.

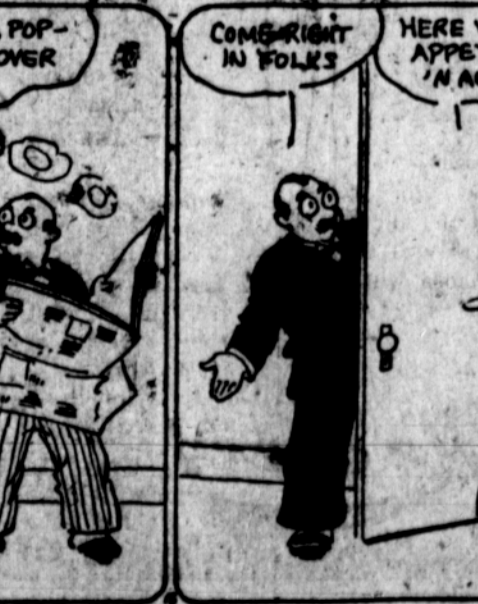
