A STANDARD FOR THE PEOPLE

A lecture on the subject "A Standard for the People" will be delivered by G. R. Pollock of New York at the Winter Garden Hall tonight at eight o'clock.

The speaker will point out the need for a common standard, a common rallying center, around which they can gather and work for peace and for all that is desirable in the relationship of man with man. He asserts that such a standard is not unattainable; that on the contrary it is right within reach and may be readily understood and appreciated by all.

Millions have fought and died around the standards of the past and to little purpose. No great good has resulted from the efforts of the past. In our day we feel that we have reached the best attainable along many lines; and yet we realize, with a sense of horror, that all the good that has been accomplished is threatened with complete annihilation. Together with plans and schemes for universal peace, there is increased preparation for war on every hand. The implements of destruction and methods of health-dealing warfare have been made so formidable that, should another war break out between any of the great powers, it is more than probable that civilization as we have known it would

Man is Held For Son-in-Law's Death

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 20.—(U.N.)—Frank B. Bentley, 54, a carpenter, was held in the city jail today on suspicion of murder following the shooting of his son-in-law, Raymond O. Parker, 26, a member of Angelus temple.

Police said Bentley told them he shot and killed Parker at the latter's home after his son-in-law struck him over the head with a paint can.

Bentley had accompanied Mrs. Parker and two babies to their home after the Parkers had quarreled and Mrs. Parker and the children had spent some time at the Bentley residence. He was opening the rear door when someone struck him with a bucket, he declared, and he drew a gun and fired in the dark.

Not until Parker cried out, "My God, you've killed me," did he realize that he had shot his son-in-law, Bentley told officers. "I think he thought I was a burglar," Bentley added.
