OREGON BANKERS, Y. M. C. A. SPONSORING THRIFT WEEK

National Thrift week, which has grown to be one of the outstanding events of the year throughout the United States, is being sponsored again in this state by the Oregon Bankers' association, the Y. M. C. A. and other organizations. Practically every city and town in Oregon will observe it. The whole movement is designed to improve the living conditions in every community and to inspire individuals and groups toward more careful methods of conduct, to the end that a happier and more prosperous America may result. The week always opens January 17, the birthday of Benjamin Franklin, the great thrift exemplar of our times. The 1933 daily schedule follows:
Monday, January 17, National Thrift day; Tuesday, National Budget or Home Economy day; Wednesday, National Life Insurance day; Thursday, National Open Your Home day; Friday, National Safe Investment day; Saturday, National Pay Bills Promptly day; Sunday, National Share With Others day.
Ten rules for a successful and happy life are proposed by the thrift committee:
1. Work and earn; 2. Make a budget; 3. Record expenditures; 4. Have bank accounts; 5. Carry life insurance; 6. Own your home; 7. Make a will; 8. Invest in safe securities; 9. Pay bills promptly; 10. Share with others.
