# POISONED GRAIN IS BEING FED TO MICE

TAFT, Cal., Jan. 24.—(UN)—Approximately 1500 pounds of poisoned grain are being used daily to kill the mice that have infested this district for a number of weeks.

Thousands of the rodents are said to be in the Elk Hills and Buena Vista oil fields and hundreds of them are marching daily upon the crops of Taft, Fellows and McKittrick, only to meet their end by eating poisoned grain.

Ernest Miners, who lives near Ford City, has accounted for 112 of the mice. Miners says he sprinkled poisoned grain around his yard and counted 172 mice and 45 gophers when it disappeared.

The highway between Taft and Bakersfield is speckled with dead mice, victims of automobile tires, according to reports here.

The campaign against the rodents is being conducted by C. H. Bowen, of the county horticultural commissioner's office, who believes the pests are being rapidly annihilated.
