NATIONAL LIVESTOCK CONVENTION CLOSES

Wyoming Delegates Oppose Others on Questions of Public Domain

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Jan. 28.—(UN)—The 30th annual convention of the American National Livestock association came to a close here yesterday after a bitter debate on last minute resolutions which found Wyoming delegates opposing representatives from other western states on questions of public domain and Mexican immigration.

Over strenuous opposition of Wyoming a resolution requesting congress to pass a law for leasing of unappropriated public domain, incorporating principles of recognition of equities of stockmen now using such areas with long term leases and fees based upon cost of administration plus a reasonable amount for counties and states in which the areas are located, was passed by a vote of 18 to 7.

The resolution also provides for establishment of grazing districts by local option. The Wyoming delegates argued that the resolution would prepare the way for "more bureaucratic control of grazing lands" from Washington and proposed a homebased proposition instead.

Wyoming also objected to a resolution protesting against placing Mexican immigration on a quota basis, southwestern stockmen insisting that Mexican labor was essential to the livestock industry. The resolution was adopted.

Contrary to expectations the resolutions committee did not present any resolution concerning Secretary of Agriculture Jardine's program for an increase in grazing fees to become effective next year.
