**CRUDE OIL FOUND IN PARTS OF SPAIN**

Drilling Has Been Carried On With But Small Results

MADRID, (UP) - Drilling for oil has been carried on recently in Spain without material results as yet. Traces of oil have been found in various parts of the country and those interested in the experiments are hopeful that a supply will eventually be found that will provide sufficient petroleum for export as well as for Spain's domestic needs.

In 1894, in the province of Cadiz (Andalusia), for the first time petroleum was noticed mixed with water coming from a deposit of sulphur. Preliminary boring in several fields of the same region, especially near Jerez de la Frontera, at San Telmo, Arcos de la Frontera, Santa Dominga de Jerez, Pambanco, revealed without doubt the existence of petroleum.

So far, the best result obtained was in Villamartin, fifty miles north of Cadiz, where after boring

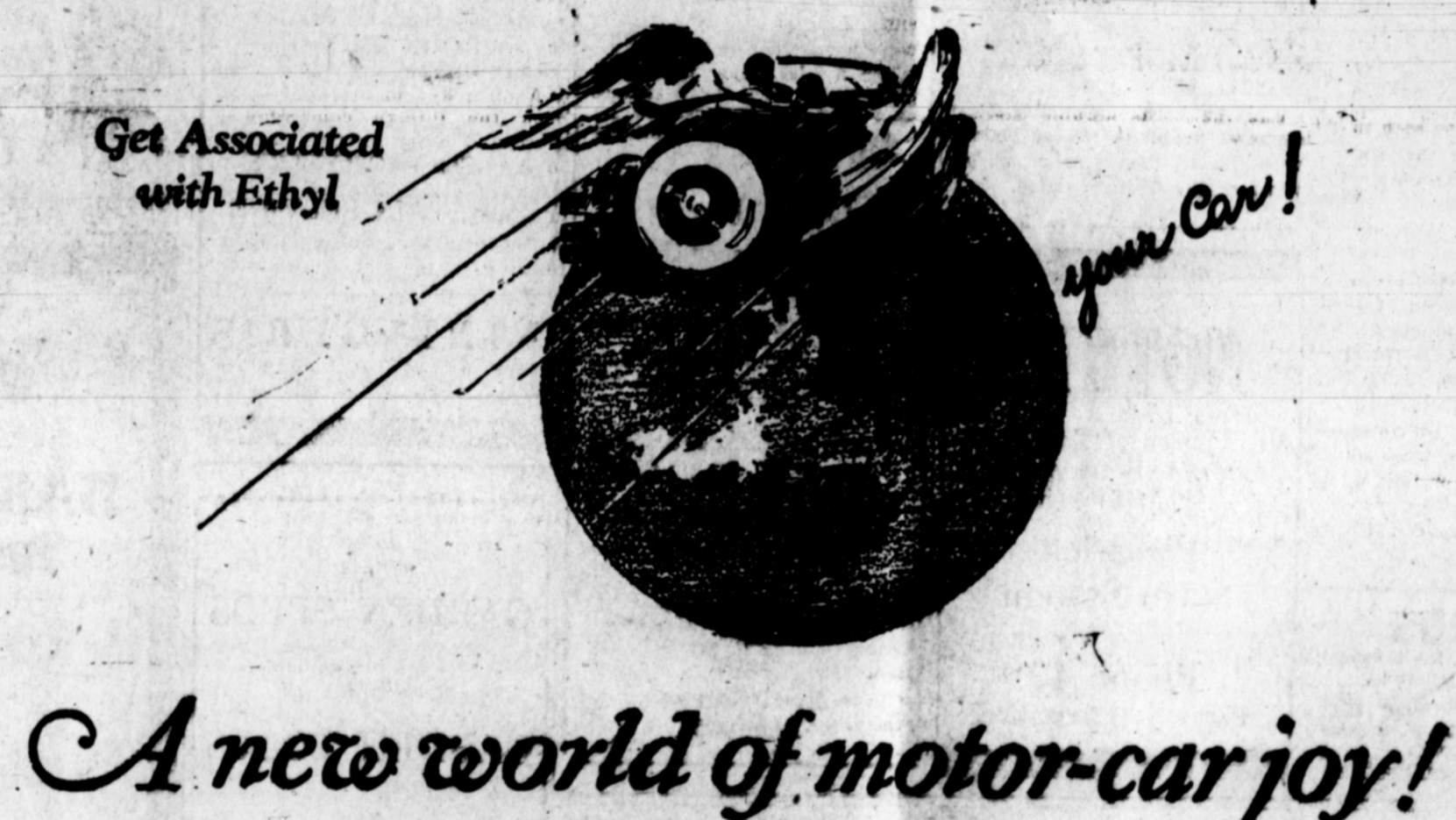
