CRUDE OIL FOUND IN PARTS OF SPAIN (Continued from page three)

ing about 850 feet, petroleum came to the surface and furnished about forty gallons daily.

The Spanish geological institute, shortly thereafter bored another well in the vicinity. Although the well was pushed deep 1,000 feet this flow could not be equaled.

It is reported that as soon as possible, new investigations will be made in the zone between Villamartin, Borsos, Arcos de la Frontera and Eperas, where geologists agree that may lay the most important deposit of liquid petroleum in southern Spain and perhaps in the country.

In Castilla, at Robredo, Ahedo, near Burgos, the Geological Institute about time ago, had two wells sunk, one reaching 1,700 feet, the other over 2,000 feet. A meagre output of about 15 gallons of petroleum daily was secured. Boring there has reached nearly 2,500 feet lately, without improvement.

The Institute has simultaneously begun experiments in the north of Spain where at Ajo (province of Santander), near the coast, boring has passed 2,500 feet already, and will be pushed as far as 3,500 feet, if possible.
