

CHINESE SOLDIERS ENLIST IN ARMY (Continued From Page One)

They make up a grouping which includes, in the Cantonese, a total of 656,000, and which accords the Northwestern bodies under Feng Yu-hsiang even less than that printed in the Year Book—only 177,000. As far as allegiance goes, the Nationalist figures seem sound, but it must be borne in mind that the 656,000 soldiers of the Southerners are largely occupants of conquered territory. They cannot easily be brought into action and in time of stress they would go to another banner as readily as they went under that of the "Reds." The Chang tso-lin soldiers, on the other hand, are, with the exception of the Shantung units mostly good men.

The one outstanding conclusion to be drawn from perusal of army figures in the Flowery Republic is that no conclusion can be drawn. There are too many factors of what might be termed extra-military nature.

Little Money. Some commanders can get no money with which to pay their men. At once their soldiers turn to banditry, or at least fall easy prey to the first rival commander who tempts them with money. Some commanders, on the other hand, preserve such strict discipline and high morale that their men can go through "hard times" without wavering much. Feng Yu-hsiang is given credit for being such a man; so is Wu Pei-fu.

Certainly one of the factors of strength of the Cantonese and of the "Christian General" has been that their occupancy of any given territory usually has been productive of better rather than of worse times. General Fong, in fact, has often cooperated with the common people in road building, like construction and similar work; likewise he has kept his soldiers well in hand and has allowed no looting. Chang Tsung-chang's troops and certain others of the Northerners have an exactly opposite reputation. Such things as these count in China nowadays.

Fourth: Good marketing facilities. The Ashland Fruit & Produce Association, the Jackson County Farm Bureau Exchange and the Ashland Creamery are among the chief agencies that serve to assist the producer in marketing his product.

Fifth: We feel that our all American population, our excellent schools, rural and the Ashland high school, the Southern Oregon State Normal school, which is located at Ashland, our various churches, our wonderful climate and scenery, all coupled with the high moral tone and the more than average intelligent citizenship will be found a large factor for success and contentment, to any family now living on Ashland Acres, and should be considered seriously by those looking toward our community for their future home.

The Disadvantages. Now let us consider the disadvantages that Ashland Acres present to those living on them.

First: We are a long way from market. Products from our acres in excess of what may be used locally must be carried three hundred miles either north or south before they are in a position to reach the world markets. Oregon and Northern California are sparsely populated so our local market is not of the best. So if we look toward quantity production it must be in such articles as are neither bulky or weighty, value considered. In other words we must get a lot of value in a small package. Eggs and butter meet these requirements ideally.

Second: Our community is small. We cannot, as yet, produce in a large way and so take advantage of quantity marketing. In the case of eggs and butter however, our markets are fairly satisfactory and with the growth of agriculture these difficulties will be remedied.

Third: Ashland Acres are just coming under irrigation. Our people must learn to use this water, and our district must adapt itself to the new conditions that must be met in changing from dry farming to irrigation. With the high degree of intelligence that is found in those living on Ashland Acres we know that these problems will be met intelligently and that their solution is assured.

In the past those who have worked both head and hands, persistently, have succeeded. Now with water to insure against periods of deficient rainfall there is added assurance that the "pay streak" is here awaiting honest effort.

Income Tax SALEM, Feb. 1. — (UN) — Another income tax bill made its appearance in the house fathered by Representative King and Senator Hall. It carries a graduated rate from one per cent on the first thousand of taxable income to a maximum charge on incomes of \$4,000 and over.

Single persons are given an exemption of \$1,500, married persons, \$2,500, corporation \$2,500 and a dependent exemption of \$500.

Soldiers Killed SHANGHAI, Feb. 1. — (UN)

Twenty two Chinese soldiers were executed at the orders of their own commander today a few hours after they had attempted to seize an American ship in the Yangtze Kiang river.

The executions, ordered by General Yang Sen at Chun Kiang, were in line with the campaign of commanding generals to calm the soldiers as well as the public at a time when uprisings are threatening the lives of foreigners.

Although Marshal Sun Chuan-fang in Shanghai has forbidden public meetings in the interests of peace the advent of the Chinese New Year season has brought complications.
