NOTICE OF SEWER ASSESSMENTS IN SEWER DISTRICTS NOS. 28 AND 29, CITY OF ASHLAND, OREGON.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, did, on the 7th day of December, 1928, after due notice of hearing on the reports of the Viewers making special benefit assessments in Sewer Districts Nos. 28 and 29, accruing from the construction of sewers therein, approve and adopt the said reports and did, by City Ordinance Nos. 844 and 845, levy against the several pieces and parcels of property within the aforesaid sewer districts the assessments as set forth in said reports, to be collected as provided by City Ordinance No. 247 as amended by City Ordinance No. 248.

Said special benefit assessments will be due and payable within ten days from date of this publication, date of said publication being February 1, 1929.

If the owner of any property so assessed for such sewer improvement, in the sum of twenty-five dollars or more, at any time within ten days from the date thereof, so desires, he may have the time of payment extended by signing an application, as provided by law, at the City Recorder's office.

When the application for the extension of payment shall not have been made and filed with the City Recorder within the ten days specified, the same shall be due and payable in cash within thirty days from and after the expiration of the ten days from date of publication.

If default is made in payment after the expiration of time allowed, such assessment will be docketed as a lien upon the property and will be subject to six per cent penalty together with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum from the date of default.
