BONES OF MURDER VICTIM ARE FOUND

Confession of Wholesale Texas Murderer Helps Locate Bodies

WHITTIER, Cal., Feb. 2.—Bones believed to be those of Mrs. Marie Vogel of Pittsburgh and two of her three children, whom George J. Hassell, Texas wholesale murderer, confessed that he killed nearly 10 years ago were found by officers this afternoon under the house in which Hassell claims he lived while in the city. The find was found by Constable Robert Way, after a search which was begun yesterday. Way said that so far as he has been able to make out, the bones of only two of the three children were recovered. Officers were aided in their search by a map obtained from Hassell by Sheriff Leonard of Hertzville, Texas.
