NATIONAL SHRINE FOR LEADERS QUARTERS

Battle of Brandywine Headquarters to Become State Property
HARRISBURG, Pa. Feb. 10 - (UP) - The colonial farmhouse which served as the headquarters of General George Washington at the Battle of Brandywine would become the property of the State of Pennsylvania and a national shrine under the terms of a bill now pending in the Pennsylvania legislature. The measure, presented by State Senator A. D. McDade, and backed by the American Legion, not only provides that the farmhouse but the entire battlefield as well, be converted into a state park. Plans are now under way for a celebration of international scope to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the battle, McDade said in presenting his bill and urged action at once so that the field would become state property before the date of the ceremony. The battle of the Brandywine, said to have been the bloodiest of the Revolutionary War, was fought September 11, 1777. The celebration is planned by the Legion posts of Delaware, Chester and Montgomery counties - parts of the battlefield being in each county. President Coolidge and Governor Fisher of Pennsylvania will deliver addresses at the celebration. The governor of the original thirteen states will be in attendance, and all states which had troops in the battle also will be represented. The Brandywine battlefield is situated only a few miles from Valley Forge, another state park and national shrine.

MAYOR OF 'HOP ALLEY' DEATH IS MOURNED

Advisor to Chinese All Over State of Colorado Dies Yesterday
DENVER, Colo., Feb. 10 - The shutters are down at a modest little home on 2024 Blake street. Quiet orientals sink along the street and glide noiselessly in and out of the house. Where last night mirth and gaiety reigned on the crooked lane in celebration of the last rites of the Chinese New Year to-night all was quiet. W. Q. Hung, the "mayor" of "Hop Alley," and advisor to Chinese throughout the state, is dead. Thirty years ago, Hung left his home in Canton, China, and came to America for an education. He settled in Denver and amassed a comfortable fortune. It was Hung, police say, who soothed the heated passions of his brother orientals and who kept peace in "Hop Alley" when long wars were breaking out throughout the nation. The less fortunate of his brothers found a liberal friend in the prosperous Hung, whose many benefactions brought him the power he did not seek, but which he administered always with justice to his fellow men. When the first lotus blossom of the coming spring spread their fragrance in flowery China, Hung's dying wish will be fulfilled. His ashes will be placed in a jade urn and deposited in the family temple in Canton.
