GANG LEADER SITS IN JAIL WITH GUN

HARRISBURG, Ill., Feb. 10.—(UN)—Charlie Birger, swagging and braggart leader of one of the southern Illinois warring gangs sat in a jail cell here supposedly with a machine gun and pistol in his lap, defying his enemies and the law.

He was under arrest for the murder of Joe Adams, who was West City's 800-pound mayor until two youths shot him a few months ago.

Adams was one of the 13 who have fallen in the past two years of internecine warfare in the bad lands. Birger's enemies are the Shelton gang. Earl, Carl and Bernard Shelton, leaders of the gang bearing their name, have started serving 25 year terms in Leavenworth penitentiary convicted of mail robbery, mainly on the testimony of Birger and Art Newman, his lieutenant.

Missionary Says South Will Win

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Feb. 10.—(UN)—Chianag Kai Shek, leader of the Cantonese forces in their march on Shanghai, will capture the native settlement in that important Chinese seaport in the belief of S. R. Anderson, for 13 years a Methodist missionary in Shanghai.

Anderson arrived here today on the liner Taiyo Maru, en route to Albuquerque, N. M.

"From Canton the hope of a real free, self-governed, China, has spread out until the country has become inflamed with the idea," he said. "Troops from the southern capital are being led by a fiery young man, Chiang Kai Shek. This man has the faculty of inspiring his people with ideals, for leader for whom the Chinese and seems to be the long looked have been waiting. He will capture Shanghai—that is the native settlement. I do not believe that foreigners will be seriously endangered, although there will be banditry and looting on the side.
