RUSS GOVERNMENT TO HAVE MONKEY FARM
Rejuvenating Operations Will be Assisted by Official Acts
MOSCOW, (UP)—The Soviet Government is going to establish its own monkey farm from which Russian scientists can secure monkeys for gland transplanting operations to rejuvenate sick or old persons. A plot of twenty acres has been selected in the town of Sukhum in the Republic of Georgia, where an almost tropical climate will make the monkeys feel at home. This is the town to which Leon Trotsky normally retires when he finds himself at odds with the party majority and it becomes necessary for him to withdraw from the picture of Soviet affairs for a time. Cocoanut palms and banana trees will be cultivated for the delight of the monkeys. These fruits grow normally close to the monkey colony. Flocks of hens will also be turned loose in the compound so that the monkeys can steal the eggs out of the nests as they do in their native jungles. Professor Tobalkin, a director of the Moscow Institute, is in Italy conferring with Professor Voronoff, the celebrated rejuvenator by monkey glands, whose monkey-breeding establishment Professor Tobalkin is studying.

United States before the Civil War. In India, slaves were chiefly servants, and were not bought and sold at auction, although a prince sometimes made gifts of slaves. It has been rare in India, however, where slaves were ill-treated. The former slaves will probably continue in the service of their old masters, but they will have the right to appeal to courts of law in the event of any injustice, and they will otherwise be free agents. The condition of the slaves will not be greatly changed generally, but the principle of non-slavery will be maintained.
