BUILDING'S WASTE SPACE USED FOR AUTO PARKING CHICAGO, (UP)—Solving the parking problem for the drivers of 572 motor cars, a novel garage is being operated in "waste space" in the Pure Oil Building of Chicago.
 At the very core of the building, in the location sometimes left as a court or light-well, fire-proof partitions have been built, and a garage installed, up to the twenty-first story. The offices obtain all the light necessary from the outside of the building, where the view is unobstructed on all sides.
 Autos enter the building from the lower level of the new two-deck Wacker Drive. From the moment the owner shuts off his engine and turns the car over to the garage, the parking operation is automatic. The auto is lifted by an elevator, and rolled to its proper stall by titling floors.

 mitted on assessment and taxation went into conference today with his committee and excluded the press.
 After two sessions the committee reported in to the senate with the recommendation that it pass as amended.
 The reason for Miller's secret sessions could not be learned, for the amendments finally coming out were not material to the measure as far as general approval or disapproval might be concerned.
 Two more important changes provided for were:
 Filing of consolidated returns by affiliated corporations.
 Filing adjusted returns by business houses doing partial payment contract business.
 Therefore the bill goes to the senate in practically the same form as it came from the house.
 The general feeling is that the income tax bill will pass the senate, although it is expected to run into some opposition.
 But as soon as that is out of the way, the governor's titling bill is due to meet battle in the senate, according to the prediction of the railbirds. The only reason they point out that the income bill passed the house was because the governor asked for it and also for the reason that a financial emergency confronts the state.

FIERCE STORMS IN CALIFORNIA DAMAGE

 hour intervals.
 Many streets and some whole blocks were under a foot or more of water in San Diego with hundreds of automobiles stalled.
 Mission Valley, a giant dry gulch, running through the city, was a torrent late tonight, but no loss of life was reported. An inch and a half of rain fell today, bringing the total since the storm started Friday to 6.61.
 Whipped by fretful gusts off the ocean, rain continued to beat down on the city tonight.
 Wind in Denver
 DENVER, Feb. 16.—(UN)—High winds which swept across Denver wrecked part of the bleachers at the city ball park, upset signboards, wrought havoc with street awnings and caused considerable property damage over the city.
 During one hour while the wind was at its highest, 13 fire alarms were turned in from roof blazes caused by sparks being carried from chimneys. All were extinguished before serious damage resulted.
 Wreckage from the ball park was blown into Broadway, one of the principal thoroughfares, and temporarily blocked traffic. Scores of awnings were ripped loose in downtown Denver and windows in many parts of town were shattered by flying boards lifted by the gale.
