WASHINGTON, Feb. 17. — (UN)—Tex Rickard is overlooking some easy money in Washington. Fighters are turning up in congress as thick as gate crashers at a training camp. Two resolutions were offered in the house today proposing a boxing commission to supervise the pugilistic activities of the honorable representatives of the people in congress.

### HOODOO BOAT CLAIMS ITS LATEST VICTIM

#### Phantom of Ill-Luck Continues to Follow Fishing Craft

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 16. — (UN)—The Gray Ghost, hoodoo fishing boat, is rolling at sea somewhere tonight, while its latest victim tossed on a hospital cot.

A relentless phantom of ill luck which has followed the craft Jeff George Michaelis, its latest owner, trapped on a rocky ledge of the western side of San Clemente Island, where for eight days he subsisted on cactus pears and rainwater.

Michaelis was taken from the ledge suffering from a broken leg, blood poisoning and exposure. His condition was regarded as critical.

Eight days ago while fishing for lobsters he went ashore on the rocky coast of the Island. The Gray Ghost, running true to tradition, slipped its moorings, and left Michaelis stranded. In attempting to scale the face of a cliff he slipped and fell. His leg was broken and this prevented from moving from a rock shelf.

Michaelis was sighted by two fishermen today. He was delirious and lapsed into unconsciousness when taken off.

Evaded the Gray Ghost, after Eli Kelly, 56 year old fisherman, following a strange covenant with his fishing comrade, James McKinley, ate the latter's dead flesh to keep from starving.

Kelly was picked up on Catalina Island in a crazed condition. The mutilated body of McKinley was found in the bottom of the Gray Ghost.

### Russian Barber

#### Poet Laureate

MOSCOW — (UP)—The Communists are "saying it with poetry." One of their most important members of the party is the Bard of the Kremlin, a peasant rhymer calling himself Demian Bedni who plays the medieval role of troubadour for the Russian revolutionists. He exercises great influence throughout the country and his rough verses are sung in many villages.

Demian Bedni is the son of a church janitor and of a peasant mother who beat him and made his life miserable. He spent his childhood working on the family farm and when he was fourteen his father sent him to an institute where he learned the trade of barber. He became a revolutionist as a young man and when the Czar was overthrown in 1917 the poet fought with a rifle in his hand on all the Communist fronts, at the same time encouraging the revolutionists with his sarcastic verses and jingles.

When the Communists came into power, Demian Bedni became one of the party's principal agents of propaganda within Russia. He was housed in the Kremlin, where he is always in close touch with the party leaders.

In a recent rhymed tale spread all over Russia, he attacked Leon Trotsky, Gregory Zinoviev and Leon Kamensky, the party's "opponents," with clever bitterness, telling a story of a farmer who saw a man try to drown himself. The farmer jumped into the river and saved
