## Tanker Establishes New Fuel Record

OAKLAND, Cal., Feb. 18.—(UN)—The motorship Lio, said to be the most modern oil tanker afloat, returned through the Golden Gate after completing a round-the-world trip without refueling during the 9800-mile voyage.

But two stops were made, and the vessel maintained a steady speed of 11 and one half knots. According to Chief Engineer Searle, the vessel consumed an average of 80 barrels of fuel oil a day on her trip around the globe. Searle reported that there was still enough oil in her bunkers after completing the trip to carry the ship to New York.

The Lio was reconitioned last year and changed into a Diesel driven craft at the Bethlehem shipyard here.
