Postal inspectors were in no hurry to send an officer after D'Autremont until they confirmed his identity through his enlistment.

The alias signature, James C. Price, affixed on his enlistment papers proved his downfall. Two outstanding peculiarities in his penmanship, an oddly formed "Capital J," and a small letter "I" circled instead of dotted, compared with the letters he had written before the crime.

That convinced the authorities that James Price was Hugh D'Autremont.
