The railroad company has arranged to place news bulletins on its fast through trains for benefit of the traveling public. The trains have been carrying New York stock quotations for several months. Public response to this courtesy was such that the Southern Pacific is now sending out a news service covering the world's news thoroughly in bulletin form. These bulletins are provided from the United Press associations. They are telegraphed to important division points and placed promptly on the trains.

NOTICE TO MILK DEALERS
 Your attention is again called to City Ordinance No. 773 which provides that all milk and cream producers; who intend to sell milk or cream ultimately to be used by the residents of the City of Ashland, shall, before offering any such milk or cream for sale either within the City of Ashland or to others who intend to sell said milk or cream within the City of Ashland, register their names with the City Recorder in order that an accurate list may be maintained of all milk and cream producers.
 Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance by April 1, 1927, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding \$200 and the costs of prosecution or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not more than thirty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.
