INDIAN OIL LAND BRINGS GOOD PRICE

PAWHUSKY, Okla., April 1 - (UN) - The Osage Indian, reputedly the wealthiest of tribesmen, has again cashed in on land that Uncle Sam thought was naught but scrub and tumbleweeds. Final check of public auction returns on Osage oil leases, peddled to the highest bidder in a small theatre here throughout yesterday revealed a total of \$2,435,700. The Kewanee Oil company established the sales record bid of \$645,000 for a 160 acre tract near Shidler, Okla., Osage county. The second price went to the Skelly interests, paying \$555,000 for a lease on a similar tract. For acreage of the same extent the Texas company paid \$305,000. The last 45 minutes of bidding saw a total of \$600,000 bid in.

Medford Telephone Calls Simplified

Beginning April 1, a new telephone operating feature is being put into effect by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, according to Myrtle E. Otterdale, manager of the Telephone Company here, which will give quicker service on telephone calls to Medford. From now on according to Miss Otterdale, neighborhood telephone service will be in effect to this point. Ashland telephone patrons will be able to obtain connections with telephones in Medford without the necessity of calling "long distance." This does not apply where it is necessary to specify the particular person to be reached, but in all cases of "Station-to-Station" calls where the patrons can take advantage of the lower rate on this type of service by asking for the telephone number only. Connections in such cases will be completed as in local calls and the charge will appear on the regular bill as usual.

All the telephone users have to do, says Miss Otterdale, is to secure the number of the Medford party from the directory and then give the number to the local operator for example, say "This is 211. I want Medford 232." This eliminates the necessity of giving such "station-to-station" calls to the long distance operator and will considerably speed up service. Considerable expense has been incurred by the Company in providing the equipment for this service and it is expected that it will be of material benefit in lessening the time required to place calls to nearby points.

PRESIDENT DECIDES ON VACATION PLACE

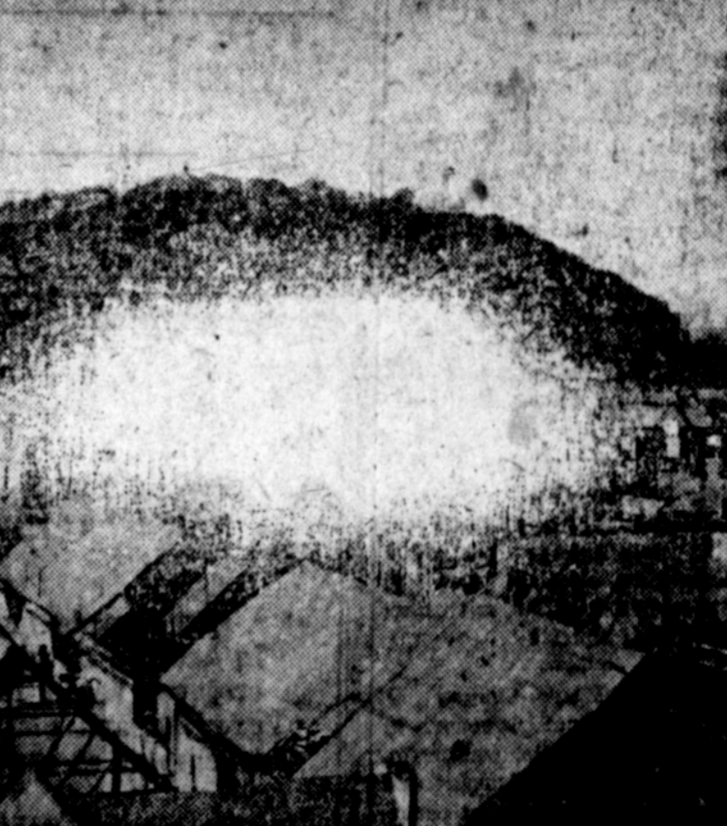
Wisconsin Will Furnish the Site for Next Summer's White House

MADISON, Wis., April 1 - (UN) - As soon as the weather and the roads permit, the location of a suitable summer White House among the lakes and trout streams in the forest country of Wisconsin will be determined. President Coolidge has determined to spend his vacation in Wisconsin, and probably will leave about June 11.

Walter B. Heinemann of Wausau, a lumberman and personal friend of President Coolidge, who was selected by Governor Fred Zimmerman to submit a list of available summer camps with adequate facilities to meet presidential needs told the United News he would make a tour of inspection early in April. One of the secret service men, presumably Colonel Edward Starling, will report to Heinemann at that time, according to a letter from the president's secretary to the

lumberman. It is expected the president will abide by Starling's recommendation as he has in the past. Starling picked Swampscott and Paul Smith's. Fear that a suitable place might not be found does not bother Heinemann. FORD IS LEADER IN GROCERY BUSINESS

Store Started Quietly Three Years Ago is Now Leader
DETROIT, March 31. - (UN) - Henry Ford is engaged in a new experiment. He is teaching his theories of how the cost of living can be reduced by applying the well known Ford principles of quantity production and machine like efficiency.

He has taken about two million of his billion and half fortune and put it to work in the general merchandise business. He offers standard brands of every sort of goods imaginable, chewing gum, sealing wax, cabbages, porterhouse steak, silk stockings, shoes, bread and butter and eggs - whatever one finds in any well managed department store at prices from ten to 40 per cent below the standard retail price.

Leading Merchant
Already his experiment, which he started quietly some three years ago, probably has made him Detroit's leading merchant. He turns over his stock 48 times a year - that is the secret of it - and makes, it is understood, five per cent on his \$2,000,000 investment. Thus far Ford has not attempted to go into the mercantile lines, excepting at his own plants, but he is confident that any man with \$2,000,000 to use as working capital, and a location where there is a large market for staple goods can do the same as he is doing.

The thing works in an endless chain. He sells cheap because he sells in vast quantities and can apply the same sort of efficiency methods to handling his goods that are typified in his factory by the machines that tighten 16 screws at a time or drill a score of holes. He can sell goods in vast quantities because he can sell them cheap.

His store or "commissary" bears no resemblance to that familiar institution of the lumber camps, the mines, the construction camps, or the army known as a Commissary. There are no vast piles of goods stacked up so that they become regulative because of their uncouth arrangements and their very quantity.
