BURIED WITH HONORS

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, April 1.—(U N)—Dr. Yee Sam Wing, who longed to be an American, has been buried with full Oriental honors.

In Dr. Yee's reverence for America there was only one concession he refused to make. Every evening he would burn candles for his ancestors in his little Confucian temple.

And so when Dr. Yee died, his passing was attended by rites of the Confucian order. Incense was lighted in the pyre and money for his journey to the Confucian heaven was burned. Cooked rice and meats were placed by the grave-side.

Dr. Yee was 84 years old when he died. He had taken out first citizenship papers when American law made it impossible for him ever to become a citizen. As a herbalist here, he had many friends, among whites as well as Chinese.
