**CHIMES IN STATION**  
 BOISE, Ida., April 5.—(P)—A lasting tribute will be paid E. H. Harriman, late railroad builder, here Easter Sunday, April 17, when chimes will ring out from the tower of the Union Pacific station, in memory of the man who played such a prominent role in the railroad history-making of the west.  
 The chimes were donated by a friend of the railroad magnate in New York. His identity is not even known to representatives of the road at Boise.  
 Their peals can be heard over a radius of about 40 miles. One of the bells alone is almost as large as the famous Liberty Bell in Philadelphia.  
 The chimes will strike every quarter, half and hour. So far as it is known they are the first chimes to be installed in a railroad station.

 The injury to Walter Johnson, which will keep the "Big Train" out for so one knows how long, served to emphasize the weakness of the Washington pitching staff. Griffith and Harris must find a barrel of talent among their recruit pitchers to bolster up the Vets. and thus far in the season it is not altogether apparent just which of the youngsters are destined for a somewhat Herculean task.
